MANAGER'S REPORT

PHASE B MAINTENANCE: In an effort to continue keeping our community beautiful and well maintained we are looking for our homeowners in Phase B to take a look at their homes and determine whether the exterior of your home needs a little facelift. The stucco, wood, and other home accents may need repair, replacement and/or painting.

The streets located in Phase B include Green Creek Trail, Bartram Trail, Chimney Rock, Bridle Trail, Pipe Springs, Kings Canyon, Big Bend, Bloomington Park, Calvert Park, and Spanos Park.

Mission Trail, Buck Springs, Baxter Woods and Pierce Mill are also included in Phase B; however, these homes were recently built and may not need any work at this time.

BALLROOM REPAIRS: During a recent inspection of the Ballroom attic space it was noted that some repairs are necessary to the ceiling beams. It is believed that K. On Tuesday, Nov. 8, the Riverside County Board of Supervisors presented Len Tavernetti with the 2016 Riverside County Friend of the Veteran Award – Individual Category. This award recognizes an individual volunteer who does outstanding work in promoting and supporting veterans.

Len's award recognized his distinguished service as a U.S. Army Infantry Officer, as the Service Officer of the local Military Office of Purple Heart, for successfully establishing 26 grave markers at Hillside Memorial Park Cemetery in Redlands for local service members whose remains were not returned home and for maintaining the Veterans' Memorial Lane.



Committee Term Limits Approved By Board

The HOA Board has voted to impose term limits on committee members.

The limits will begin Jan.1, when all committee members with over four years of service will be removed.

In the future, members will be limited to two terms of two years each. The Board can grant a single two-year extension “to retain committee knowledge and expertise.” Residents may serve on only one committee at a time.

Also, the Board will allow month-to-month extensions for any committee that cannot meet quorum without an extension, or make the Board liaison to the committee a voting member until quorum is met, up to a year at a time.

The vote adopting the limits was 4 to1, with Board Secretary Fred Weck opposed.

Many new vacancies will be created and the Board held a Committee Membership Drive on Nov. 3 to recruit new members (see story on page 15). The drive had a strong turnout. On Nov. 2 there was a Town Hall meeting to allow homeowners to comment on the limits proposal, which was mailed to them on Sept. 29.

Those who responded by mail were in favor by a more than two-to-one margin. Those who spoke at the meeting were divided, with most of those opposed citing the speed of the move, the loss of special knowledge and experience, or the need for term limits at all.

The original proposal was made by a group of residents who felt their ability to have a voice in governing the community was hindered because there were no vacancies on committees that had many long-serving members.

A similar proposal was rejected some years back because committee chairs unanimously objected, saying it was difficult to find effective members and terming them out would damage the committees’ ability to function. Since then Four Seasons has grown and the pool of prospective members is much larger.

Weck, who voted against the measure, said he felt the limits should be imposed over a longer time, to allow a more orderly transition.

He said, “The Board currently has the authority to remove a committee member for cause. But to endorse and promote a policy to callously remove hardworking committee members simply because they are guilty of too much tenure ... is cold hearted and doesn’t seem like good business practice.”

Term limits have been a goal of Board President Len Tavernetti, Vice President Jeanne Glanville, CFO Claudeen Diaz and Member Jerry Monahan. They feel the limits reflect the wishes of the community. Glanville said “Four of us campaigned on term limits and four of us got elected.”

In a related action the Board created an Editorial Board to produce the *Breeze* magazine. The Editorial Board will be overseen by the Communications Committee, but Editorial Board members will not be subject to term limits.

Tavernetti said the *Breeze* is “unique” because it has a contractual agreement with its production company, Image Up Advertising, to provide the text, photos and editing to produce the magazine. That process should not be interrupted, he said.

The Communications Committee will continue to operate the Four Seasons website and continue all its other duties except magazine production, which will be delegated to the Editorial Board.

There's An App For That

It's my intention to devote this column to serious smartphone apps. But there are many apps that are just fun. And since this is the holiday season, how about looking at Christmas, Chanukah, and Kwanzaa apps.

I didn't find a single Kwanzaa app at Apple App Store, but I found three at Google Play. The two free ones don't look very good, but the one called Kwanzaa, which costs 99 cents, looks quite interesting. This is not a children's holiday app. It's serious in its orientation to European culture, and it goes into some detail regarding the principles and history of Kwanzaa. For those with such an interest, it's easily worth the cost.

There are many Chanukah (or Hanukkah if you prefer) apps, both Apple and Android. Since the eight nights of Chanukah fall on different dates each year, there are many apps geared to how many candles to light on which days. Like most things in Judaism, there are rules. Do you light the menorah (or more properly the chanukiah) from left to right or right to left? Do you light one candle on the first night and add one each night, or start with eight and work down? There are many apps to help. Many have lighted Chanukah candles burning; you can even choose how long you want the candles to last. And there are many apps with Chanukah games and coloring books.

Two in particular caught my interest. Chanukah Guide and Menorah-Chanukah. These apps have the history and practice of Chanukah as well as prayers in Hebrew and English and transliterations. They are excellent apps for the holiday.

When it comes to Christmas, there are endless apps. There are Christmas countdown apps, holiday game apps, photo apps for



Christmas where you can take a smartphone picture with holiday overlays, cooking apps, and sing-along Christmas carol apps.

I found three that interested me. On Apple there's Gift It – Christmas Shopping List. It's an easy way to keep track of your gift purchases. You can have multiple lists. You create a list name and add descriptions and amounts for each entry. There's a total at the bottom of each list. This is a handy free app, but it does come with the occasional annoying ad.

On Android I found two Christmas music apps that may interest you. Christmas Radio gives you a selection of radio stations around the world. If you tune in early, you're not likely to hear much Christmas music, but you can hear topical radio in various countries. I assume that there will be plenty of Christmas music closer to the holiday. However, this app is a good example of one so loaded with ads that it may not be worth even a free download.

Christmas Songs & Music has over 30 musical selections, including eight renditions of Jingle Bells. Unlike Christmas Radio, ads

are discreetly placed in this app.

I also found a fun little app that lets you play Christmas carols yourself. Christmas Carols Piano on Android (there's Christmas Piano Songs on Apple) displays a one-octave keyboard. You select a carol and it lights up the keys. Tap the lighted keys in sequence and you're making music.

Add to your holidays with amusing, enjoyable, and/or educational apps.

VETERANS: IT'S TIME TO RE-UP!

THE EPC NEEDS YOU

Your Association needs you, your training and your experience! You veterans answered the call once before and now you need to do it again. This time you won't have to dig foxholes, paint rocks, spit shine your sandals, or scrape barnacles. You can still have three hots and a cot. There will be a monthly formation to get-out-the-word, but no long marches, rope climbs or STD movies.

In the service you learned to take care of your buddy. That's what we want you to do. Here, your buddy is your neighbor. But, you need some refresher training and in-theater situational awareness. Learn where the aid station will be, where to get supplies and how to call for backup.

When we have an emergency (earthquake or fire), coolness and

experience will keep our casualties to a minimum. You have those traits. They may be a bit rusty but in a crisis, they will come through.

Our small cadre at the Emergency Planning Committee is recruiting, training and organizing our residents to help each other until the relief forces arrive. We need to identify to them the most seriously injured for immediate aid, account for all our residents and distribute food, water and supplies as we recover. You know how to do this.

Our mobility may be diminished but we can man radios, answer questions, give directions and offer comfort. So, head for the recruiting office at the Lodge and sign up. You won't need your parents' permission this time. Ask EPC member Al Blair what you can do for him. Uncle Al Wants You!

Chef's Corner

Turkey & Veggie Chili

This healthy turkey and veggie chili will be great for the cooler winter days ahead. The flavors are wonderful and become richer as leftovers the next day. It provides just the right balance of sweetness from the corn, heat from the spices, and freshness from the vegetables.

Prep Time: 5 mins. • Cook Time: 40 mins. • Total Time: 45 mins.
• Serving Size: 2 cups • Serves: 6



INGREDIENTS

- 1½ tsp. olive oil
- 1 lb. lean ground turkey
- 1 red bell pepper, chopped small
- 1 yellow onion, chopped small
- 5 garlic cloves, minced
- 1 28 oz. can crushed tomatoes
- 1 14 oz. can kidney beans, drained and rinsed
- 1 14 oz. can black beans, drained and rinsed
- 1 14 oz. can pinto beans, drained and rinsed
- 1 cup frozen sweet corn
- 1½ tsp. cumin
- 1 tsp. unsweetened cocoa powder
- ½ tsp. garlic powder
- 1½ Tbsp. chili powder
- ½ tsp. paprika
- ¾ tsp. dried oregano
- ½ tsp. ground cayenne pepper
- ½ tsp. salt
- ½ tsp. ground black pepper
- 2 tsp. reduced sodium soy sauce
- 2 cups water

DIRECTIONS

1. Heat the oil in a large heavy bottom pot over medium heat.
2. Add the turkey and cook until browned, stirring to break it up as it cooks.
3. Add the onion, red bell pepper, and garlic, and cook for a few minutes, stirring, until tender.
4. Mix in canned tomatoes, beans, corn, spices, and soy sauce. Add the water and stir to combine.
5. Bring the chili to a boil, and then reduce heat to low and simmer partially covered for about 30 minutes until the chili thickens. (If you're finding that your chili isn't thickening to your desire, try removing the lid completely.)
6. Serve with freshly baked corn bread.

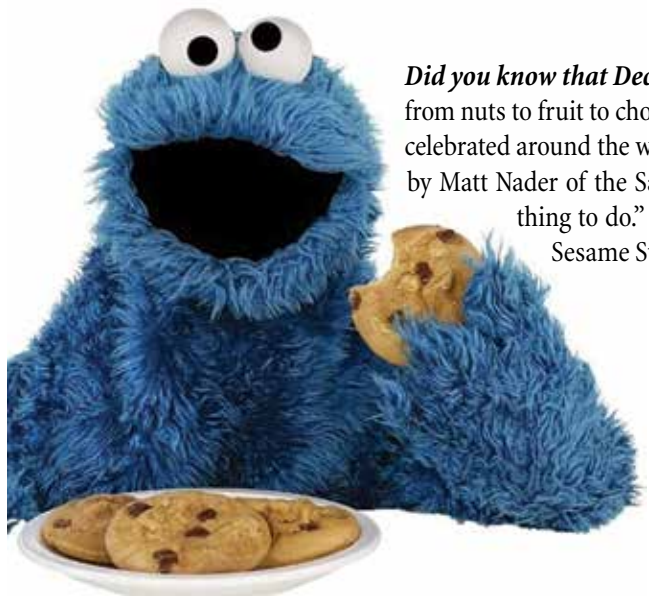

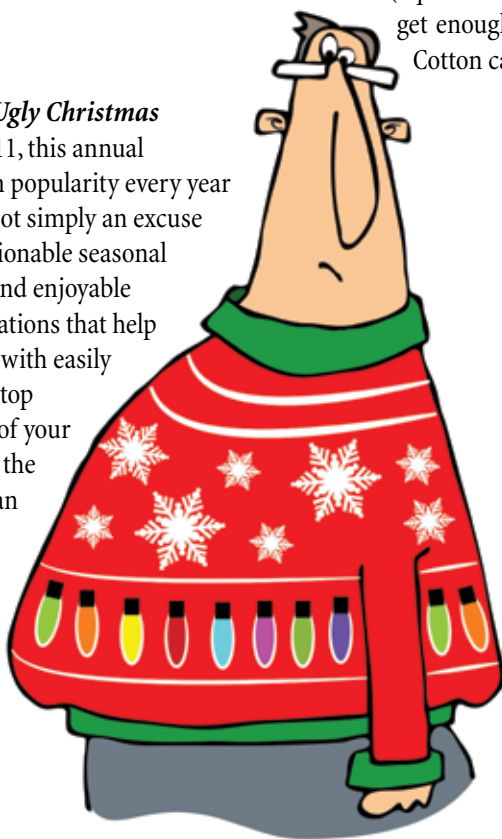
In celebration of that major pig-out known as Thanksgiving dinner, here is a mostly-food version of "Did You Know?" for your enjoyment:

TREE TRIMMING: WHY IT IS IMPORTANT

The three-part answer is: it makes them pretty, it makes them healthy, and it makes them safe. Let's start with safety. Not usually a thing you think of when you're gazing out your window at your stoic oak or crape myrtle, but safety plays a big part in not only the trimming process but the overall safety of the area around your home. Trimming back dead branches or useless "shooters" lessens the potential fire danger should your tree or any structures nearby catch fire. Another safety concern is debris on the ground. Not only can this be potentially dangerous for pedestrians, but if left unattended for long periods of time, dead plant matter can mold and rot which attracts insects. This can also happen within the tree itself. If dead matter is left untrimmed, the decaying material can attract wood boring insects which will weaken the tree and eventually cause it to fall.

Proper trimming of trees promotes health beyond that of just safety. You've heard the phrase: An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure, right? Better to prevent any safety hazards by promoting healthy tree growth. By removing any dead matter you are making room for the tree to grow new, healthy branches and leaves, and instead of using its resources to combat disease and pests, it can now develop a healthier root system.

Beyond health and safety, the one aspect most people will notice

first is the outward appearance of a nicely trimmed tree. Keeping your trees somewhat uniform in size by trimming is an easy way to develop pleasing aesthetics. Anytime a tree dominates the landscaping it can be a tricky fix. If you groom your lawn and plants well, no matter the size or species of the tree, your yard will be appealing visually. By removing rotting leaves, dead shoots, and unhealthy branches you are able to showcase a healthy, handsome area.

SAFETY COMMITTEE

Safety comes in three forms; safety of the community; your personal safety; and the safety of your property.

Four Seasons at Beaumont has experienced a very low crime rate as compared to the surrounding communities and cities. The traffic flow and traffic accidents in this community are an area where safety is becoming an issue. The speed limit on Four Seasons Circle is 30 miles per hour. There is a need to watch the speed limit on this roadway. There have been complaints of vehicles stopping on the roadway – in the middle of the road – causing concern. There have been complaints of vehicles parking on Four Seasons Circle – a no parking roadway – causing limited visibility of oncoming traffic. There have been continuing complaints of residents walking in the roadway. There have been complaints of vehicles parking too near the sidewalk; this is causing part of the parking vehicle to hang over

into the walkway of the sidewalk.

There are few reports of threats to personal safety made to the police and Lodge staff. If work place (Lodge, pool and spa) safety concerns occur please report these incidents to Lodge staff. This reporting is the only way Lodge staff and the Board of Directors can fix a baseline for possible action. If a resident observes or experiences a personal safety issue, report it to the police department.

The safety of property is a concern in terms of limited security fencing to some areas of our community and an unsecured construction gate, to name a few. K. Hovnanian has been working in these areas. It is still important for residents to continue to follow the rule - if you see something of a safety concern, report it to the Lodge staff. ~ *Dennis Gray*

FINANCE COMMITTEE

We met on Oct. 25. Financial statements were reviewed for the month of September, which reflected the following significant amounts:

Total Assets \$7,982,510 including checking \$442,249 and reserve assets \$5,775,855. Operating money market and CDs totaled \$1,666,350. Total Liabilities were \$289,472 and Total Equity of \$1,917,182. Net loss for the month is \$16,910 and year-to-date net income \$96,401. Front yard cost center expenses were over budget by \$846 and Springdale cost center expenses were under budget by \$784.

Tom Mull has resigned and Baron Ginnetti was accepted as Tom's replacement, pending board approval. Five vendor proposals were reviewed and recommended for board approval. Two homeowners and Board Liaison, Claudeen Diaz, were present as guests as well as special guest Board member, Jeanne Glanville.

Noel Myers and Georgia Coleman presented status on review of vendor contracts.

COMMUNITY PLANNING & TRANSITION COMMITTEE

We had a budget of \$12,000 to perform acoustics testing in our Ballroom, Lodge lobby/bistro area, and the multi-use room in the RCN. We accomplished these services for less than half the amount allowed. We now know how floors, walls and ceilings contribute to echo and the noise level in each of these spaces, and are formulating plans to make improvements.

The Ballroom floor covering is scheduled to be replaced in January, 2017. There will be more hardwood surface than now, and there should be more options available for use of the room, whether as one single space, or in a one-third/two-thirds configuration, or used as three separate spaces.

Research has started for the final and complete hand-over (transition) of all community assets from the developer to us, the Homeowners Association. There is much to discover and digest, and

some hard questions to ask and answer. We are not yet prepared to report any conclusions or options in this matter, but we'll keep you informed as progress is made.

Two-way communication with you, the homeowner, is a priority with us. Those who use the Internet will soon have a convenient means to accomplish this, with a special community website set up just for this purpose. If you don't use the Internet, we will still provide communication through printed material, questionnaires and input sheets.

Our regular meetings are held in the Conference Room of the RCN at 9 am, usually the fourth Thursday of the month – but due to this time of the year, our next meeting is Thursday, Dec. 15. ~ **Willis Fagan**

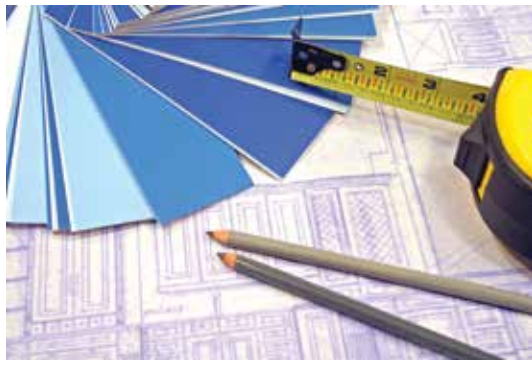

ARCHITECTURAL REVIEW COMMITTEE

We appreciate working with homeowners as they continue to improve their properties. The cooperation and understanding in discussing some of the detail in plans that are submitted makes our job that much easier. There are times when we are unable to approve certain requests as they do not meet the published guidelines. If possible, we work with homeowners on small variances. When approving large projects, such as back yard landscaping, it is important that the work be completed in accordance with the plan that was submitted and approved. As you probably realize, once the work is completed and an Exhibit C is submitted, one of the committee members will visit your property.

We have seen work that was not completed in accordance with the approved plan. If you make changes after your approval, those changes must be submitted to the committee as an amendment to your original plan. Should work be completed that was not approved

and is outside the guidelines, there is a good chance that it will need to be fixed which may increase the costs to homeowners. If your contractor makes a mistake that is outside the guidelines then the cost would be theirs. However, if you make a request of your contractor that was not approved, the cost to correct the situation would be the homeowner's. Again please be sure your improvements meet the approved plan.

Our committee meets the first and third Wednesday of each month at 8:30 am in the RCN Conference Room. We encourage homeowners with plans submitted to attend the meeting in case we have any questions or need clarification. We invite all homeowners to come to our meetings and observe how we work. If you have an interest in joining our committee, please be sure to come check us out. 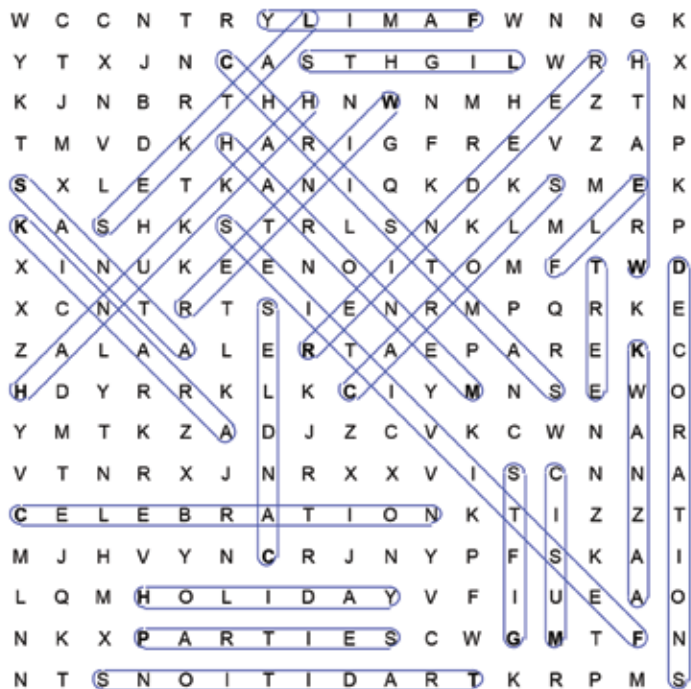

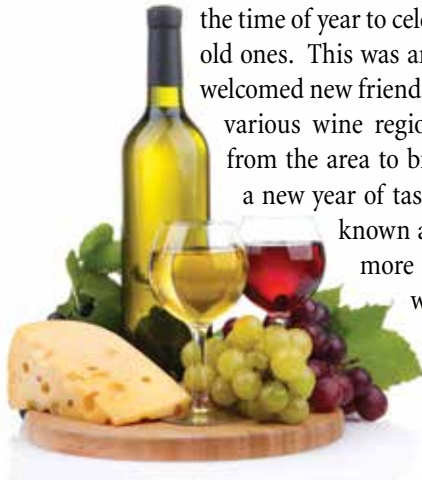

CAMERA CLUB

We meet the third Tuesday of each month at 6:30 pm in the RCN main lobby room. Thus our December meeting will be Dec. 20. Visitors are always welcome. We invite all photographers, regardless of skill level, to join us for our regular meetings, workshops, speakers, field trips, and in-house demos. For example, at our November meeting, our Chairperson, Irve Sturner, gave an excellent demo and tutorial on the use of adjustment layers with Adobe Photoshop software. It was very interesting and informative.

For the November meeting, the assignment was twofold: 1) take a photograph using distortion. This could be from using a lens that distorts (e.g. a very wide or fisheye lens) or distorting the picture using software (e.g. using Liquify command in Adobe Photoshop). 2) take a picture of the Supermoon that appeared the day prior to our meeting. The supermoon appeared on Nov. 14 and, according to CNN online and scientists, this supermoon is bigger, in fact, than it has appeared at any point in the last 68 years, and was the biggest of the 21st century. CNN online went on to say we won't see its like again until 2034.

Special thanks to Camera Club member Bill Taylor for alerting us to the supermoon's appearance and an excellent tutorial on the best way to photograph it.

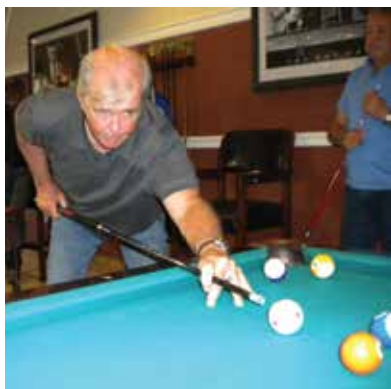

Use Berkley Power Bait with the garlic scent and be ready to take home some fish for dinner.

The second secret spot is Diamond Valley Lake located in Hemet, California. If you go on a Wednesday, you can rent a boat for half price if you are a senior. Ask the people at the marina and they will tell you where to go to catch fish. They will also advise you on what bait to use and what type of fish are hitting that day.

The third secret spot is the Salton Sea located in North Shore California. It takes about one hour and 30 minutes to get to the Salton Sea from Four Seasons. Go to the Salton Sea State Park located on the Hwy.

111 side of the sea. Fish off the jetty and get ready to take home a bunch of fish. My wife caught so many fish that she complained that her hands hurt. I complained my hands hurt because I had to clean all the fish she caught. The best time to go to Salton Sea is in May.

Now I want to be very truthful to all my friends that are thinking about going fishing. There are no secrets when it comes to fishing. All you have to do is ask any fisherman and he will answer any question about fishing that you might care to ask. I use the internet to book fishing trips or find out where the best places are to go fishing. Google will get you started on the ground floor of fishing and will be as close as your computer or cell phone.

Hulda Crooks was a long-time resident of Loma Linda. She often spent time with children in the community, encouraging them to appreciate nature and stay active. In 1991, Loma Linda dedicated a park at the base of the south hills as Hulda Crooks Park. The park trails crisscross treeless hills under powerlines and offer great views of the San Bernardino Basin.

Our seven hikers enjoyed the pleasant weather of a warming fall

day with clear skies. The first mile was along a well-maintained dirt road at the valleys between two hills. At the Beaumont Ridge Trail marker the trail began to snake up one of the hills toward Edison’s supports for our energy demands. It was then down the other side and back up another hill. Here we decided that the lunch bell was ringing in Redlands so we retraced our path to the parked cars. And then we closed in on the gourmet burger and craft beer saloon, Eureka Burgers, near Trader Joe’s in Redlands.
