Voters Put Diaz and Tavernetti on HOA Board

Two new members were elected to the HOA Board in an election that was marked by a surprisingly high voter turnout.

Claudeen Diaz and Len Tavernetti — both running for the first time — won over three other candidates as 73 percent of Four Seasons households cast votes. Each of the nine districts had more than a 60 percent turnout, with District 8 reaching 91 percent.

Diaz and Tavernetti replace the Board's outgoing President Jacque Sneddon and Treasurer Wayne Staples, both of who ran for re-election but were defeated. The fifth candidate, Jerry Monahan, ran for the first time.

The vote totals were Tavernetti, 813; Diaz, 795; Staples, 467; Sneddon, 385, and Monahan, 259. There was one write-in vote for Jack Dexter and 6 blank ballots were cast only to help districts reach quorum.

In Four Seasons elections, reaching quorum is of vital importance. Otherwise, the district delegate can cast all the district's votes as he or she sees fit — possibly deciding a close election.

Glennon Gray, executive vice president of FirstService Residential in California, the company that manages Four Seasons, said "In 30 years in this business, I have never seen such a high turnout."

Gray spoke before the Annual Members meeting on April 7, where the election results were announced. The votes were counted by three judges of election: residents Barbara Miller, Carol Napolski and Julie Stayner.

Tavernetti is a retired Army colonel and aerospace executive. He said he has three issues that he would like to address immediately as he joins the Board. First, he feels the election process itself needs to be reviewed, that it has a lack of transparency in the way the votes are counted and announced, and problems with getting the positions and qualifications of candidates out to the voters. Second, he wants to see improvements in communication between the Board and residents, possibly by having a daily update on the Four Seasons website, use of blanket emails and other measures. Third, he wants to install term limits for both committee members and Board members.

Diaz, who holds an MBA and has a wealth of management experience, said her first priority is "To get my feet wet; to find out what's expected before we start making a lot of changes." She was complimentary of her predecessors. "They did a good job. They did what they thought was expected of them. I thank them for their long years of service."

"The finances of this community are in very good shape," she said. "The Finance Committee made good recommendations and the Board followed them."

After the election Tavernetti was named Board president, Diaz vice-president and incumbent member Jean Sandoval secretary.

Staples, the outgoing treasurer, said he "wishes the new Board members well, and I look forward to two more good years" for four Seasons. He thanked residents "who supported me in the past and in the election."

And the other winners are...

Three Four Seasons residents made some significant money for doing their civic duty.

They were winners in the drawing approved by the HOA Board to encourage voting in the yearly Board election.

Those eligible for the drawing were voters in the three districts that had the highest percentage of homeowners casting ballots.

The highest district was number 8, with 72 of its 79 votes cast — reaching 91 percent. District 5 had 87 percent and District 6 had 79.

Winners Philip St. John of District 8 received \$300; Richard Yanes of District 5 got \$200 and Phyllis Beede of District 6 got \$100.

Getting out the vote in Board elections is particularly important because of a provision in the CC&Rs: Districts that fail of a majority (50 percent plus one) do not have their ballots opened and the district delegate can vote the whole district's voting power as he or she sees fit. This makes it possible for a single delegate to decide a close election.

That possibility was avoided by the high turnout in this year's election. Each of the nine district made over quorum — the lowest reached 62 percent.

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COMMUNICATION ZONE

The Communication Zone is a vehicle for the Board of Directors to provide information about Four Seasons to the homeowners. The following are questions from homeowners who attend the *Meet with Jean* sessions and responses from Board members.

The residents continue to be concerned about people speeding on Four Seasons Circle towards Breckenridge gate. More 30 mph signs on Four Seasons Circle are being considered. A 30 mph sign has been attached to the speed radar sign pole. Will talk with the builder to determine if speed signs can be placed after Plymouth Rock towards the Breckenridge gate. Rumble strips before the first roundabout will be installed soon as well as the pedestrian cross walk. Will send suggestions for more cross-walks to Safety and Facilities Committee. Attend the Safety and Facilities meeting the first Tuesday of the month at 9 am.

Why isn't there a Letters to the Editor section in The Breeze? Currently, the Communications Committee does not accept or publish "Letters to the Editor," as noted in the published Purpose, Editorial Policy and Submission Guidelines for *The Breeze*. The committee did discuss this issue at their April 6 meeting and has decided to further review the subject. The board will be advised of the committee position, and possible recommendations at a later date. Attend the Communications meeting the first Wednesday of the month at 10 am.

The residents would like the comments that come back from homeowners after a 30-day review to be discussed in the Board Meeting. They especially would like to hear the written comments. This has been done for the homeowner comments about the Summit and Rec Center 3 and were placed on a poster for all residents to view. This type of display can also be done for any other document that goes to the residents for a 30-day review.

Where will the money come from when the renovations begin in the Lodge, i.e., the craft room, exercise room and Bistro? Will the reserves need to be increased to cover these renovations? Renovation costs come from operating income or excess funds, which are ample to cover the costs. Reserve funds can only be used to replace or restore existing furniture or equipment. Therefore, Reserve funds will be unaffected by these renovations.

A resident states people are using the Summit showers for long periods of time, i.e., 30 minutes or more. They are not sure if the people are showering after swimming and use of the treadmill or there to just take a shower. Either use is OK. The HOA can hang a sign asking residents to be aware of the drought and not take extended showers.

Chef's Corner

Prep: 20 min.

Cook Time: 12 min.

Total Time: 32 min.

Yield: 4 servings

This recipe balances the sweet and tangy peach glaze with the savory and smoky flavors created by grilling the meat outdoors. The sweetness of the peaches enhances the smoky, savory, seared marks on the pork chops. This dish can be made using either boneless or bone-in pork loin chops which are quickly seared on hot grates over direct heat and finished away from direct heat. While finishing, the seared chops are brushed with the peach glaze.



INGREDIENTS

1 cup peach preserves
1/4 cup red wine vinegar
1/2 tsp. minced fresh thyme
1/8 tsp. cayenne pepper
1 (16 oz.) bag frozen sliced peaches
1 tsp. Dijon mustard
4 bone-in rib or center cut pork chops,
about 1 inch thick
Salt and pepper

DIRECTIONS

1. Prepare the glaze sauce by simmering the preserves, vinegar, thyme, and cayenne in saucepan over medium heat until reduced to 1 cup, about 3 minutes. Reserve 1/4 cup glaze. Add peaches to saucepan with remaining glaze and simmer until peaches are soft and glaze is slightly thickened, about 10 minutes. Off heat, stir in mustard. Cover and keep warm.
2. Season pork with salt and pepper and grill over hot fire until well browned and internal temperature reaches 145 degrees, about 6 minutes per side. Brush with reserved glaze and cook 1 minute longer. Transfer to platter and let rest 5 minutes. Pour the still warm sliced peach mixture over chops and serve.

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Who Will Care For Your Pet?

I like to think that most of us in Four Seasons have made arrangements for our estates.

We have our wills and our trusts and are taking care of our finances, property and personal possessions. But how many of us have made arrangements for the care and well-being of our pets once we are no longer here or able to care for them?

Our furry companions are often an afterthought and this can lead to some big issues as to what happens to them in the event of emergency situations.

Naming a caretaker for your pet is very important. It will give you the peace of mind in knowing your pet will be cared for after you have left this world and give your pet a secure place to live the remainder of their days. Many people assume that a good-hearted friend or relative will gladly take on our cats or dogs, but this may not always be the case.

Suddenly taking on a new pet, especially long term, can be very stressful and doesn't always work out, especially if the named caretaker is elderly, in poor health themselves or has other pets that may not mesh with a newcomer. It is always best to discuss this with the person you choose to provide for your pet well ahead of time, as this can be a huge physical and financial responsibility, especially if the pet is aging or in need of special health care.

It would be in good order to offer some financial remuneration to ease any fiscal burden that may accompany the pet. Because we don't have these wonderful pets for as long as we would like, it's a good idea to revisit this portion of your will or trust often and make

any changes in the pets you have and the people you have chosen as their caretakers.

Which brings me to another related subject. Do you have someone who knows your dogs and cats who could step in at a moment's notice and care for them should you, for one reason or another, become unavailable? God forbid you have an accident or a health issue and are in the hospital, unable to communicate your pet's needs. I have formatted a card (below) to be kept in your wallet, right by your driver's license. It is a self-explanatory card that states: "My pet is home alone. In case of an emergency, please call..." Please cut this out and fill in the spaces with the names and phone numbers of your pet caretakers. Make sure they are friends or relatives that know your pets, have a key to your home and are familiar with your pets feeding and exercise routine. A little pre-planning can save you a lot of worry later on.

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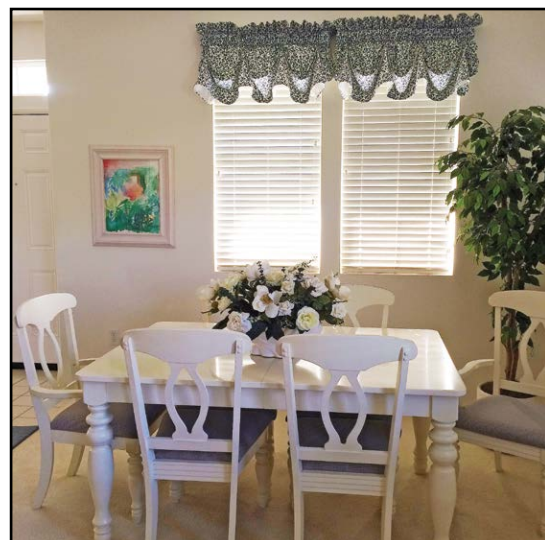


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A Beach Cottage in Beaumont

When the opportunity arose for me to write another article spotlighting residents who first discovered or displayed amazing new talents only after moving to Four Seasons Beaumont, I immediately thought of Eileen and jumped at the chance to interview her. She very graciously agreed. We set a date and when the time came, I ventured out. The day was rather warm and breezy, a rather typical spring day in Beaumont. I found her Springdale home easily.

Eileen had made room for my car in her garage. When I stepped out of my car I swear the weather had changed. Was the air a bit cooler and did it taste ever so slightly of salt? “Welcome to my beach cottage” Eileen said. “This is my dream home.” As she showed me through her charming bungalow, decorated mostly in white with pastel touches,

she went on to explain that after she retired from 42 stress-filled years as a legal secretary and paralegal, she looked into three other places before she came to Beaumont. She first bought a house in Las Vegas, then the Tri-Cities, Washington area, then in St. George, Utah. None of those places were a good fit so she began researching 55+ communities until she found Four Seasons at Beaumont. Her only question was, “Where’s Beaumont?”

So she moved here, into a community so new that there were dirt roads, no gate, no clubhouse. But she found promise in one of the Springdales and set about to bring some of the beach to Beaumont. And she succeeded. Her beachy decor took me back to many summers of my life which were spent blissfully in the ocean, on the sand, and in a beach house in Malibu.

A new house wasn’t the only exciting new item in Eileen’s life. She also met Pete Antoine the first week she lived here. They’ve been together for 10 years now, married for four in November. But Eileen didn’t want to give up the house she loved so much and Pete didn’t want to give up his big TV and other ‘man cave’ touches, so they came to a great decision: they each kept their own house. So now they live in both. Sort of like snowbirds, but with a shorter commute.

“I was extremely shy as a child,” Eileen told me. But she always had a wonderful imagination which allowed her to escape her somewhat painful childhood, and later, a sometimes unhappy marriage. She

started writing at eight, often transporting herself to an imaginary kingdom where she re-lived movies, changing the endings until she was content with them. "I've always had a 'go-to' place in my head, a place where my amazing imagination has helped reshape my reality into something creative and self-healing."

Eileen's aspirations have always turned toward creative enterprises. She has written three books and taught herself ballet. She wanted to be a prima ballerina, but her family prohibited that endeavor. But she watched and practiced anyway, and when she was in college at BYU she took dance. Her instructor asked her to audition for an upcoming event. She did, and danced en pointe in the opera Aida at BYU. It is still a thrilling memory.

Eileen left college after two years and got married. Although her marriage did not endure, she had three wonderful children, two girls and a boy. And now she has nine grandchildren. She is close to them all, as she is to her sister Ruth.

Even after writing three books and poetry, teaching herself ballet, having a long career in a difficult field, rearing three children, enduring a difficult and painful marriage, and moving from place to place after she retired, it wasn't until she moved to Four Seasons that she actually realized that she loves a challenge. Her new mantra is "Watch me." Try telling her she can't do something and out it pops, "Watch me!"

So when the chance to live her longtime dream of writing and producing a musical appeared, she grabbed it. She loved the group

ABBA and she loved their musical "Mamma Mia" and she had a story to tell. And so she sat down and wrote out everything she needed and needed to do. How? "I just figured it out."

Of course. Simple. 18 songs, 36 pages of script, two casts. Simple.

It took a year of rehearsals until Eileen was satisfied. And "Gamma Mia" was a huge success. Teri DiMarino-Davidson wrote a wonderful in depth article about the event in the November 2011 *Breeze* so I won't recreate her work here. But it wouldn't have happened without Eileen's dream and persistence.

And now she has another production under her belt. She wrote, directed and produced "Seasons" which received even greater critical acclaim than "Gamma Mia."

Does she have another production in mind? She didn't say yes or no.

So now you can find Eileen teaching and/or participating in several billiards groups. And leading weekly Bible study groups. And taking part in competitions, often with her very talented and capable husband Pete, and being a devoted grandmother to nine grandchildren and... and... and.

Somewhat overwhelmed, I bade good-bye to this gracious and talented woman and got into my car. As I pulled out of her garage it suddenly seemed to get warmer, with a hot breeze blowing on me.

Now I know Eileen is capable and determined, but does the air really get cooler and saltier near her beach cottage? Impossible!! And yet, the phrase "watch me" suddenly pops into my head.

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FINANCE COMMITTEE

The Finance Committee held its regular meeting on March 29. The minutes from the February meeting were presented and approved.

Following are the more significant items from the February Financials: Total assets balance is \$7,387,815. This includes checking account of \$174,476 and reserve assets of \$5,274,473. Petty cash is \$500. Money market funds and CDs are \$1,664,073. Total accounts receivable (delinquencies) is \$57,514 and allowance for doubtful accounts is \$35,194. Total liabilities as of Feb. 29 are \$230,427. The net income for the month of February is \$23,968 and total equity of \$1,882,914 is a surplus balance. The Front Yard Cost Center expenses for February were over budget by \$884 and over budget year to date by \$2,771. The Springdale Cost Center expenses for February were over budget by \$222 and over budget year to date by \$416. There were no investments to be reviewed.

Wayne Staples provided a report on the outstanding accounts

receivables noting a receipt of \$15,000 on a past-due account. There were five vendor proposals presented and recommendations forwarded to the Board.

Homeowner input included a presentation by Brian Anderson on term limits for committees. A total of 10 homeowner guests were in attendance. We thank each of you for your interest in the finances of our community.

Agenda items for the May meeting include reserve study proposals and committee term limit review. Our next regularly scheduled meeting will be May 31 at 1 pm in the Lodge Conference Room. Currently there is one position open on the finance committee. If you have an interest I suggest you obtain an application form from the front desk in the Lodge, complete it and return it to the front desk. We ask that you then attend three meetings after which we will contact you for an interview. ~ *Noel Myers*

Two industrial-grade Sharp microwave ovens have been purchased and received. A preventative maintenance company needs to be found to service the

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EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS COMMITTEE

BEAUMONT ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICER ENLIGHTENS GROUP

On April 7, Beaumont Animal Control Officer Chris Harwood gave an excellent presentation on “all things animal”

He explained the importance for residents to have proper identification on their dogs and cats. Specifically, he strongly suggested getting pets a collar with the owners’ name, address, and phone number. Equally important, he encouraged pet owners to have a microchip inserted which allows officials to identify lost pets and reunite them with their owners.

The city of Beaumont offers microchip insertion for a one-time fee of \$20. Additionally, a life-time pet license is available for only \$8, for ‘altered’ dogs who have a microchip. He also reminded pet owners who have moved their residence to update that information with the agency who issued the microchip.

Officer Harwood said that approaching warm weather can present special hazards to pets. Snakes are more likely to be out and about from April through October, so residents who walk their dogs on the trails should be vigilant. Of interest to pet owners whose dog

may have been bitten by a snake, Banning Veterinary Hospital, 3559 W. Ramsey, (951) 849-3864, has the anti-venom serum which is administered after the snake bite. According to Officer Harwood, not all veterinary offices carry that medication. Also, pets left in parked cars with the windows up can suffer extremes of temperature inside the car that can be life-threatening for the animal.

Officer Harwood also reminded residents that our Four Seasons Community was constructed in a habitat that was once home to bobcats, mountain lions, snakes, and a multitude of less threatening animals. Consequently, he encouraged residents to not leave pans of water, dog and cat food, etc. out overnight. Many of the ‘wilder critters’ roam our community at dawn, dusk, and night, and they are looking for food and water, and oftentimes, any food will do.

This event, sponsored by your Emergency Preparedness Committee (EPC), had numerous brochures and handouts, procured by event organizer Anita Worthen, our Pet Rescue Team Chief. The next meeting of the Emergency Preparedness Committee will be Tuesday, May 17, at 10 am at the Lodge. All residents are welcome to attend. ~ **Fred Weck, EPC Co-Chair**

Supervisors OK New Emergency Alert Network For Riverside County Residents

Riverside County supervisors recently approved a \$225,000 contract with an emergency notification network operator to set up a system to keep residents informed of floods, fires and other events that could pose a threat to public safety.

The Board of Supervisors signed off on an Emergency Management Department agreement with New Jersey-based SwiftReach Networks Inc. to implement and maintain a countywide Early Warning Notification System over the next three years.

“The new EWNS will significantly improve the county’s ability to quickly notify the public of emergency incidents as necessary via voice messages, text or email in multiple foreign languages, using translation software provided as part of the EWNS services,” according to a statement posted to the board’s policy agenda.

The county has had a notification system in operation since 2007. However, officials decided a change was necessary and sought out a new vendor to put a “next-generation” system in place.

Three companies bid for the work, and SwiftReach Networks was selected following an evaluation by representatives from the county Emergency Management, Fire and Sheriff’s departments, as well as tribal entities and officials from “desert cities.”

The new system will incorporate technology enabling county officials to instantly flash alerts to residents who have signed up for EWNS voicemails, text messages, emails, faxes and pages. The contract’s effective date is retroactive to March 1 and ends on Feb. 28, 2019 — with the option of one-year extensions. ~ **Fred Weck, EPC Co-Chair**

El Niño Update

The record warmth and low rainfall has caused many to cast doubt on the ongoing “Super El Niño’s” capacity to generate above normal — let alone near normal — precipitation this winter. While precipitation has been closer to normal over the central and northern parts of the state, thus far, this winter has been disappointing to those hoping to capitalize on above normal sea surface temperatures.

A warm ridge of high pressure remained stationary off the West Coast frequently during the past month. This led to very warm temperatures and below normal precipitation. As dry and warm as it has been, it would be premature to dismiss the ongoing El Niño as a bust. Historically, some of the strongest El Niño winters have seen periods of dry weather interspersed with the heavy rainfall.

The weather summary for March through June 2016 is for above normal precipitation in Central and Northern California, with near normal precipitation in Southern California along with some periods of unusually heavy late season rain possible.

LANDSCAPE COMMITTEE

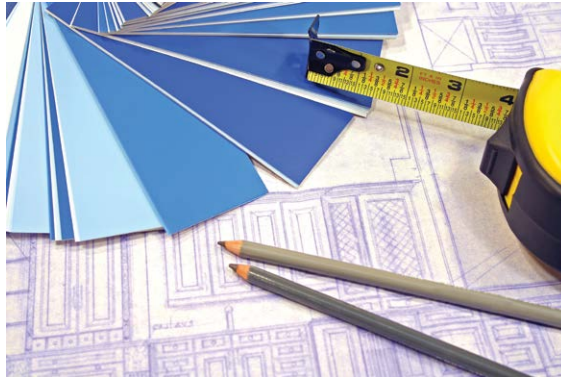

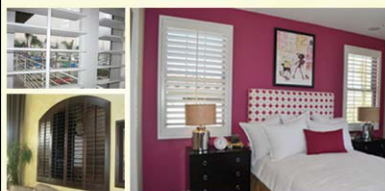

Emily, aka Abby Bliss, opts to fend for herself on the streets, selling herself for food and shelter. Bohjalian depicts two Emily's: one is kind and cares for a 9 year-old foster child, keeping him safe. The other is a drug addict who cuts herself out of self-loathing. In either one of these personalities, she can outwit the system and escape capture. She is capable of being alone and possesses insights that make her powerful. Emily serves as an excellent commentary on nuclear catastrophes as she experiences the sheer pain of missing her parents and her dog and needing a friend.

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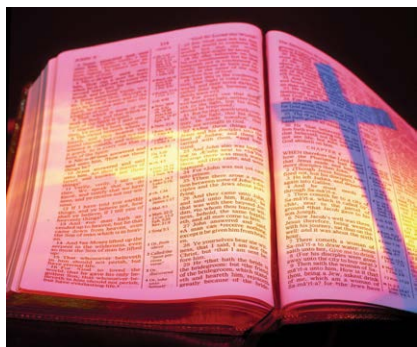
“BELIEVE...” WOMEN’S BIBLE STUDY

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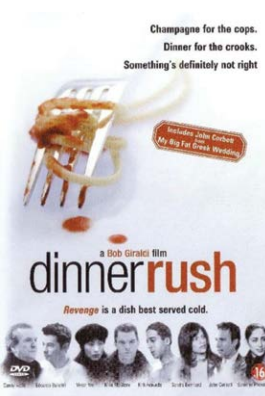
COUNTER CULTURE CINEMA

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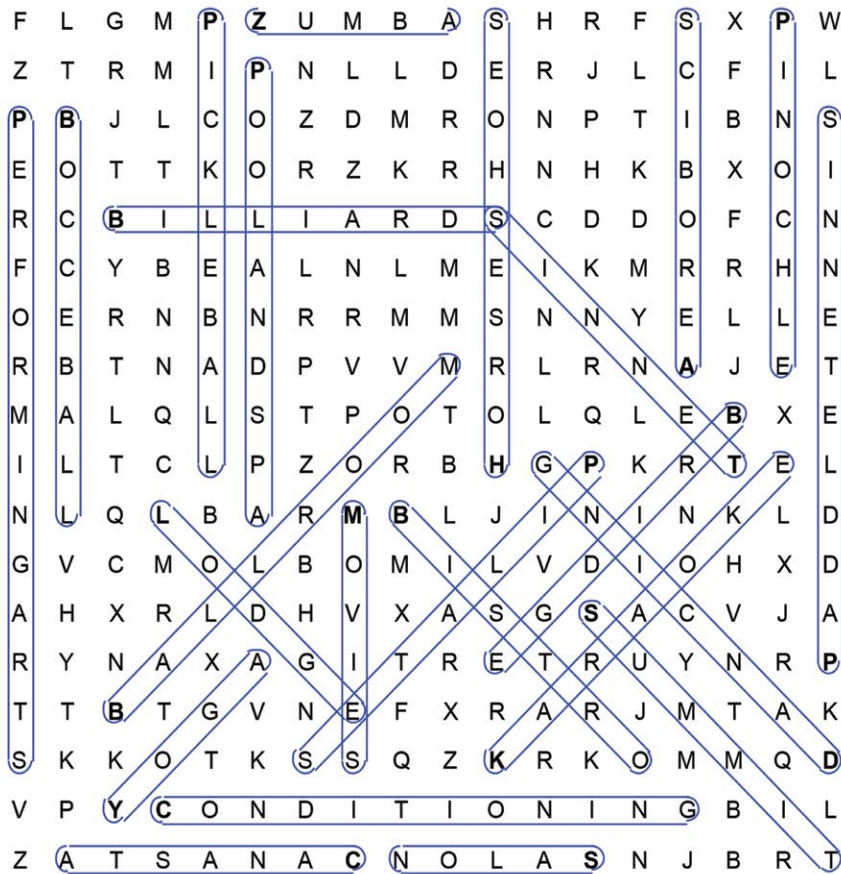
