# MANAGER'S REPORT

## SPECIAL ELECTION

We recently received notice from K. Hovnanian that they have vacated two of their four Board seats. Therefore, the Board of Directors has set a special election meeting on Wednesday, Aug. 3, at 6 pm in the Ballroom to fill the two vacated seats.

If you are interested in serving on the Board of Directors, please prepare a Candidate Statement and return it to the management office.

If you wish for your Candidate Statement to be included in the *Breeze* before the election, the form should be returned no later than Friday, June 10 at 12 pm. If you do not wish to have the form included in the *Breeze*, the form must be submitted no later than Friday, June 24 at 12 pm in order to have your name appear on the Secret Ballot to be mailed to the membership.

The decision to hold a special meeting was made because the governing documents state that the builders rights to the two seats expired on the 10th anniversary of the first close of escrow in the community; the first close of escrow occurred on Oct. 25, 2005. The governing documents also provide that until 100 percent of the homes have sold, K. Hovnanian shall have authority to elect at least 20 percent

of the Board.

The Board of Directors consulted with the association's legal counsel on the method required to fill the two seats. Legal counsel advised the Board that as these positions were to be elected in April, 2017, they are not subject to appointment and must be filled through a special election.

The special election schedule is as follows:

May 23: Call for Candidate notices mailed with monthly billing statement

June 10: Deadline to submit candidate statement if you wish for it to be included in the *Breeze*

June 24: Deadline to submit candidate statement to be included on the ballot

June 29: Record date set

June 29: Meet the Candidates night at 6 pm in the Ballroom

June 29-July 1: Election packet to be mailed to all homeowners

Aug. 2: Inspections of Election count the ballots

Aug. 3: Special election at 1 pm in the Ballroom

# OBSERVATIONS FROM THE BOARD PRESIDENT

The HOA Board election was one in which the voters expressed a desire for change. As always, some who voted for change will like the new ways and some won't and will have difficulty adjusting. The former will feel rewarded and the latter will realize that another election is only 12 months away and build hope.

Communication was clearly the dominant issue for the voters, followed by term limits. The challengers campaigned on these talking points and amassed 69 percent of the vote. In fact, they won all nine delegate districts by a 2-1 margin—a convincing win. Their vote total appears to exceed that needed for a CC&R change to create Board term limits — but that can come at a later date or by candidates fulfilling their own term-limit pledge.

We are addressing the communication shortfall with daily reports sent by email to those who request this service, and by displaying printed copies at the Lodge counters and in the Library. Work is also

underway to refresh the web site with a new look, tailored to our community, updated daily and posted on one of the monitors in the computer room. Our open Board meetings now feature on screen displays of the topics being discussed.

On May 10, a new, annual State of the Association presentation was made to the members. Our community is now 10 years old, over 75 percent built out and on the threshold of independence from the builder. It is time to begin preparing for the build out. This will involve assumption of responsibilities for our trails, the Potrero River Conservancy, all of phases C-D-E, and our own budget. We will also need to revise our governing documents.

To this end I will ask our Board to establish an advisory committee and begin the research of the process to include lessons learned from other HOAs that have built out.

## COMMUNICATION ZONE

*The following are questions from homeowners who attend the Meet with Jean sessions with responses from the resident Board members.*

*Q. Aren't people from other communities or guests of our residents supposed to sign-in at the desk when entering the Lodge or Summit? Are they allowed to walk on the trails or use the exercise rooms without the homeowner present?*

A. The Four Seasons resident is supposed to be with their guest when they sign in at the front desk of the Lodge or Summit. This also includes people from outside Four Seasons who are attending an event, playing pool, cards or other activity. The Four Seasons resident is to accompany a guest when walking the trails or visiting the Summit. No outside guest can use the exercise rooms or equipment. Also, prospective buyers who receive a pass for Smitty's must sign in at the Lodge desk.

*Q. Is the HOA responsible for maintaining the mailboxes? To whom do the residents report an issue with the mailboxes?*

A. Notify First Services Residential general manager for any issues with the mailboxes.

*Q. How do the residents become members of an ad hoc committee? Can residents attend ad hoc committee meetings?*

A. Per the common rules of all committees in the Four Seasons at Beaumont Community Guidelines, an ad hoc committee is established by an enabling resolution passed by the Board of

Directors (see Common Rules of all Committees, Part 2, Page 1, 2, 3, 5). Committees shall consist of members in good standing who are approved by the majority of the directors representing a quorum at any noticed Board of Directors meeting. Committee members will be appointed in accordance with the bylaws, section 6.15, page 15, which reads:

Committees.

1. It is recommended residents complete an application to join one of the nine HOA committees, interview and become an active member.

2. When a request has been made that ad hoc committee members are needed, complete a committee application and turn it into the office. You will be notified of an interview time.

3. Residents can attend ad hoc committee meetings, however, the same rules apply as for a guest at any committee meeting.

*Q. The street light that was removed after an accident on Four Seasons Circle has not been replaced. When will the street light be installed?*

A. The street lights are the responsibility of the City of Beaumont. It is unknown when the light pole will be replaced.

## DID YOU KNOW THAT JUNE 3 IS FISH AND CHIP DAY?

Fish and Chip Day commemorates this fundamental meal of the working class, and while its roots may lay on Britannia's foggy shores, there are few places in the world that this comfort food hasn't found its way to. In the late 1800s, trawl fishing became a major part of the industry in the North Sea, resulting in a growing availability of fresh fish in areas further inland, especially within the cities. Cheap, filling and high caloric food created an excellent foundation for a working class that held incredibly physically demanding jobs. Thus it was that "chippers" - the vendors that served fish and chips to the people on the street - started cropping up all over major population centers. It used to come wrapped in the day's news, with the tang of malt vinegar, but on a plate with a little tartar sauce works just as well.



## DID YOU KNOW THAT JUNE 10 IS BALL POINT PEN DAY?

On June 10, 1943 the Biro brothers, Laszlo and Gyorgy, became owners of US Patent 2,390,636 - better known around the world as the ball point pen. The Hungarian inventors' new pen, inspired by the quick-drying inks used by professional printers, was as remarkable as the first fountain pen had been the century before. Nowadays, their invention is the ultimate cheap and disposable product, but it was once a luxury product, available only to the rich.



## DID YOU KNOW THAT JUNE 12 IS PEANUT BUTTER COOKIE DAY?

The ancient Aztecs and Incas made a paste by mashing roasted peanuts, and that was the first known peanut butter. Peanut butter cookies have been popular since the early 1900s, and in 1913 the wife of the 28th U.S. president, Woodrow Wilson, published a list of her cookie recipes including one for Peanut Cookies that used peanut butter. To promote peanuts in 1916 a bulletin called "How to Grow the Peanut and 105 Ways of Preparing it for Human Consumption" was released that included three different recipes for cookies. Find your own recipe and enjoy!

## DID YOU KNOW THAT JUNE 25 IS GLOBAL BEATLES DAY?

It was in the year 1960 that music history changed forever - four young boys came together and changed the world one song at a time. They started their career playing cheap dives all over their home town of Liverpool; their explosion in popularity came on the heels of their first hit song "Love Me Do," and love them we did. Global Beatles Day celebrates the huge influence they brought to the world, not just with their musical sounds but with the values they professed and believed in. Throughout their entire career they promoted the idea that we could all live in a peaceful world, built on the ideas of truth, love, and reaching beyond the boundaries of current human consciousness. So break out your favorite old albums and honor this influential band.



## DID YOU KNOW THAT JUNE 29 IS CAMERA DAY?

Cameras and photography have developed substantially over the years, from their early roots with the French inventor Joseph Niepce right up to modern day digital photography. Joseph Niepce developed the heliograph, a technique used to produce the world's first known photograph in 1825. In 1839, Louis Jacques M. Niepce took the first fixed image that didn't fade. He is recognized for his invention of the daguerreotype process of photography. His method required 30 minutes of exposure. Tintypes were developed in 1856 by Hamilton Smith; decades later, George Eastman invented flexible and unbreakable film that could be rolled. This was the birth of the first Kodak that was offered for sale in 1888. In 1925 the first Leica went on sale and its immediate popularity spawned a number of competitors. The Japanese camera industry began with the birth of Canon in 1936 with its 35 mm rangefinder. The Polaroid, the world's first instant-picture camera, appeared on the market in 1948. The first digital camera, by Fuji, was sold in 1989 in Japan and cost \$13,000! These days everyone has a camera on their mobile phone - what a different world!

## FINANCE COMMITTEE

The Finance Committee held its regular meeting on April 26. The Financial Statements for March were reviewed. Following are the more significant items from the March Financials: Total assets balance is \$7,514,181. This includes checking of \$374,598 and reserve assets of \$5,344,636. Petty cash is \$500. Money market funds and CDs are \$1,664,138. Total accounts receivable (delinquencies) is \$31,690 and Allowance for doubtful accounts is (\$24,189). Total liabilities as of March 31 are \$277,255. The net income for the month of March is \$19,398 and total equity of \$1,892,289 is a surplus balance. The Front Yard Cost Center expenses for March were under budget by \$1,693 and over budget year to date by \$1,078. The Springdale Cost Center expenses for March were under budget by \$442 and under budget year to date by \$1,015. There were no investments to be reviewed. There were four vendor proposals presented, two from Landscape

committee, one from Safety and Facilities committee and one from Management. A total of five guests were in attendance, three home owners and two Board members. We thank each of you for your interest in the finances of our community.

A recommendation was sent to the Board to accept the resignation of Claudeen Diaz from the Finance Committee and accept Wayne Staples as a new member of the committee. We currently have one opening on the committee and two homeowners applying. If you have an interest I suggest you obtain an application form from the front desk in the Lodge, complete it and return it to the front desk. We ask that you then attend three meetings after which we will contact you for an interview.

## EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS COMMITTEE

Are you ready for the big one?

Earthquakes are usually the disaster we think of first but we need to be prepared and concerned about other natural disasters that can occur such as fire, flood, wind, and hazardous materials spills. Recently a strong wind came through our neighborhood and picked up a neighbor's patio umbrella and dropped it on their roof. As we enter the wildfire season with the effect of years of drought in California, we can expect large fires to occur and our community is in a wildland fire risk area. As this article went to press, last month's fire in Canada caused evacuation of 88,000 people, burned 329 square miles and destroyed more than 1,600 homes and buildings. Here are some actions to take before, during, and after a wildfire.

### ***Before a Wildfire:***

- Know your risk. Learn how often wildfires occur in your area. Know when the greatest risk is and take safety precautions.
- Evaluate your surroundings and landscape accordingly.
- Clearing dead plants at least 50 feet away from your house is advisable.
- Make sure you test your smoke alarms periodically to ensure they are working properly.
- The emergency kit you have for earthquakes will be sufficient for wildfires.

- Decide in advance what you will take with you. Keep personal belongings to a minimum and if you have to leave immediately for safety reasons, leave everything behind.
- Create an emergency plan. Choose a meeting place away from your home for family members to gather in case you are not together when a fire happens. Designate a neighbor to evacuate your pets in case you are not able to get home during a fire.

### ***If a wildfire is approaching:***

- Prepare to evacuate. Listen to emergency channels and know the status of the fire. Load necessary items in your car so you can evacuate quickly and immediately if told to.

### ***After a wildfire:***

- Return home only after officials have declared it safe to do so.
- Watch out for ash pits and hot spots. Even after a fire has been extinguished, small fires can flare up without warning. Check your house and surrounding property for hot spots and extinguish them immediately.
- Document the damage to your house. Take photos and video and make a written list. You will need this documentation for insurance purposes. ~ **John McLaughlin, EPC Co-Chair**

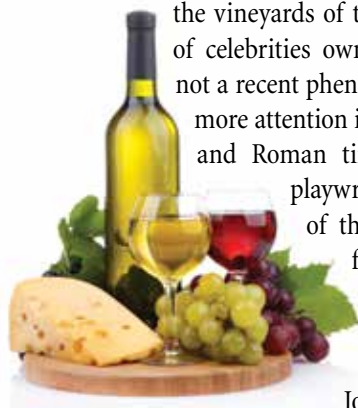
with our group. We then discussed and conducted a constructive critique of all. We learn a lot about various techniques, software, and hardware to enhance our work.

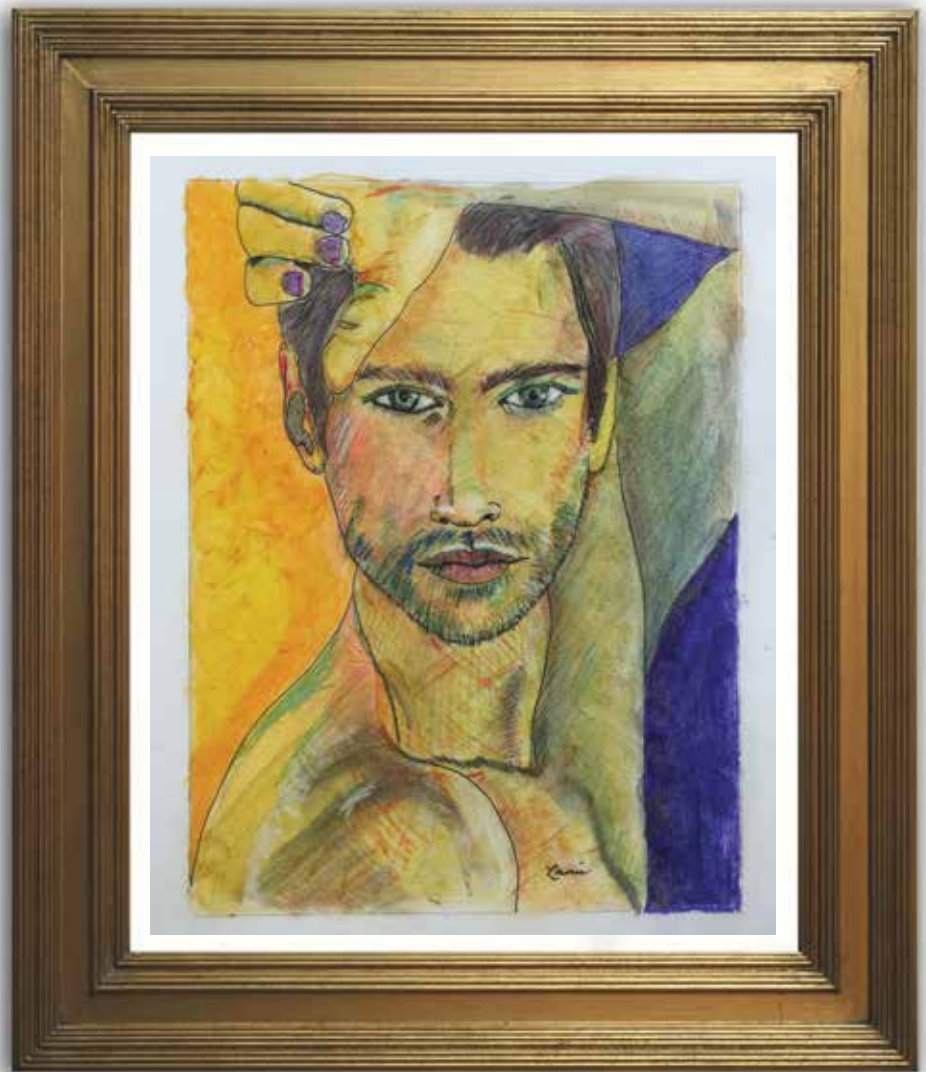

Some of that is completely understandable, for death forces us to say good-bye to those we hold dear, and makes us learn how to live without them. How painful that is. But how much we add to that pain by worrying if we are crying too much, if we are crying for too long, if we should be doing something besides crying, if we are upsetting our friends and family by crying, if we should accept offers of help, if we should not accept offers of help, if we should mention the deceased, if talking about them makes others unhappy, if not talking about them makes others unhappy, if we should get rid of their belongings or keep them, if we..., if they..., if... if...if. Oh my! Our poor, tortured hearts and heads.

We talk about all of these things in the Bereavement Group. Of

course the goal is for each person to do what feels right to them. It is their loss. It should be their way of grieving, without all of the voices in their heads telling them what to do or not to do.

It is much easier to achieve some internal peace when there are others to share thoughts and ideas with. And of course in every group there are some struggling with the same issues and some struggling with others. We help each other by talking out loud, not just in our heads.

It is so wonderful to watch new participants when they realize that they are not that different from the others. Week after week, as they get to know each other, peace flows in and inner discord diminishes. What gifts we can be to each other.

If you are struggling with what is the right and/or wrong way to move forward during this painful and difficult time of loss and sadness, please come join us. We will be glad to listen and glad to share what we have experienced.

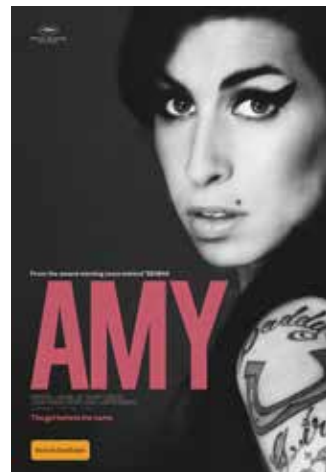

## 4X4 SEASONS

Our April trip was to explore the gold mines in the Pinto Mountains which are located east of Twentynine Palms between Route 62 and Joshua Tree National Monument. We exited the I-10 and stopped at the Cottonwood Visitor Center where we discovered that all National Parks were free that week. We left the paved road onto Old Dale Road, which is designated for four-wheel drive vehicles only. This is the main road through the Pinto Mountains. Gold was discovered in the 1880's and mining continued through the 1930s. A couple of mines continued into the 1950s. There are numerous mines in the area: one group is off the Brooklyn Mine Trail; the other is off the Old Dale Road. Because of time restraints we chose to explore the mines off of the Old Dale Road. The first mine we stopped at was one of the last mines to close. As you can see from the picture, there is modern equipment. The mine has a vertical shaft of about 150 feet with three horizontal shafts. We continued on Old Dale Road which led to various other mines. We stopped for a picnic lunch and enjoyed the beautiful day. Afterwards we explored the New Dale Mine. It

employed approximately 2500 people during its heyday. All that remains now is a huge pile of rusted tin cans and numerous concrete foundations. This trip offered us the opportunity to use four-wheel drive. There were a couple of sections where a climb over boulders would tilt your vehicle towards large rocks on the opposite side of the trail. Some of those rocks bear marks of vehicle paint, showing where others were not so careful. We needed to use a spotter in some areas. This trail exited onto Route 62, 19 miles east of Twentynine Palms.

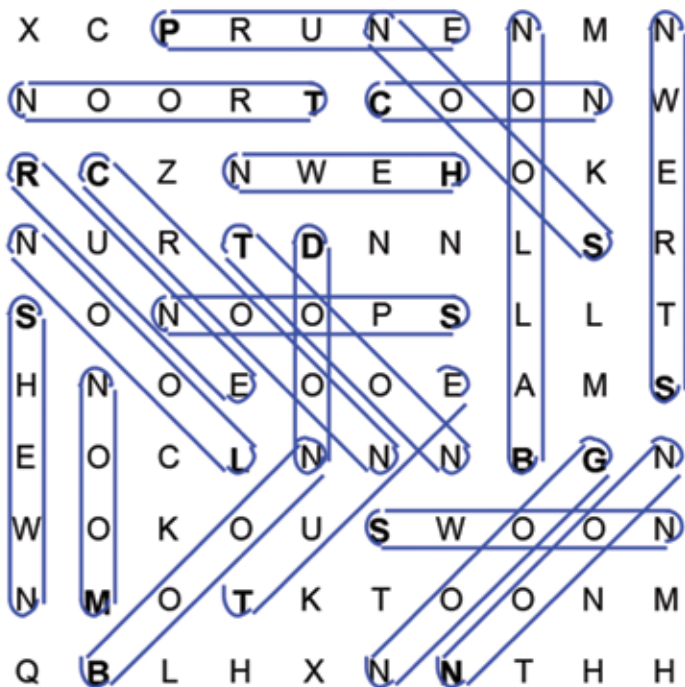

## AMATEUR RADIO CLUB

The Amateur Radio Club. Is it boring? Just for men? The answer is no!

I joined this club shortly after I moved here in 2010. There were several things motivating me then. First of all, I wanted to help build the emergency preparedness of Four Seasons. I still do. Second, I wanted to be as personally prepared as possible, in case the big one arrives. I still do. And third, I wanted to channel my late husband. He had died shortly before I moved here. He worked in aerospace. More specifically in satellite communication. He was a radio frequency engineer and I thought that if I concentrated really hard, maybe some of his energy and knowledge could be communicated to me. Did I really believe that? No, not really. But somehow being part of this group made me feel closer to him. It was also a way to honor some of what he had taught me. He had helped bring more left brained involvement into my rather right-brained life. And I wanted to continue that trend.

Not everyone in this club is a ham radio operator. The club also encompasses another very important and very easily learned emergency preparedness component, The Family Radio Service, or FRS. Basically, you use a hand-held radio which is a walkie-talkie, and it can play a huge part in keeping Four Seasons safe. But we need more people. Just think: with a little training you could have a tool with which you could help take care of yourself, whoever lives with you, and the community in case of a disaster.

The club conducts training sessions for this. And there is weekly practice, called a net, in which we all check in with each other using a prepared script. It takes only five to 10 minutes weekly on Wednesday

evenings, if you are available. That's a lot of bang for the buck!

For years, I participated in the club, as an "FRS member." I went to the monthly meetings, as did many others, several of them women. I participated in the weekly nets and occasionally attended an FRS training session for brush up. And I talked about getting a ham radio license. And I studied, in brief bursts, for my technician's license.

I decided not to pursue the license because I got busy with other activities. But I never stopped my participation in the club because I really believe in it. If we could get more people trained and practicing with FRS, we could have a system in place that would be a real emergency preparedness backbone for Four Seasons. Wouldn't that be terrific? Now don't you want to help?

I'd like to be the first woman in the club to get her license while living in Four Seasons.

The current Amateur Radio Club president did a sneaky thing. He offered a one day crash course, about six hours of study followed by an exam for the entry level ham radio license. How could I pass that up?

I couldn't. I spent that Friday with three other students and three volunteer examiners and took the test. And guess what? I passed! I have a call sign! I'm proud of myself. And I'm sure Murray (my late husband) would have been proud of me, too.

So now it's your turn. Come to a meeting. Hear what's going on. See our new radio room. Learn how you can participate. Learn how easy it is. You really do owe it to yourself.

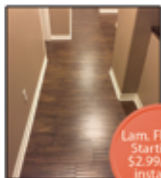
